The higher the worth contributed, the greater the possibility of winning the entire pot. Probability-based based on relative skin worth.

- **Interface and Experience:** A smooth, responsive UI with very little lag guarantees that timed games (like Crash) register bets accurately.
- **Consumer Support:** Reliable 24/7 live chat support is important for fixing deposit failures, trade hold concerns, or account questions without delay.
