

Garage door problems don't often happen at a suitable time. A door may get stuck halfway, fail to respond to the remote control, sag on one side, or make a loud bang from a **damaged garage door spring**. Because an overhead garage door is substantial and operates under serious tension, careful inspection matters as much as price.
