- **Crash:** A multiplier begins at 1.00 x and rapidly increases. Gamers need to cash out before the multiplier "crashes." If they fail to do so in time, they lose their stake.
- **Live roulette:** Similar to standard casino live roulette, however typically adapted with three colors (e.g., Red, Black, and Green), where Green uses a huge payout due to lower chances.
- **Coinflip:** A timeless 1v1 video game where 2 gamers wager comparable skin worths, and a digital coin flip identifies the sole winner.

- **Prize:** Multiple gamers dump skins into a common pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the person who contributed the most has the greatest analytical opportunity of winning the entire pool, though luck can prefer low-tier contributors.

Comparison of Common CS: GO Gambling Game Types
