

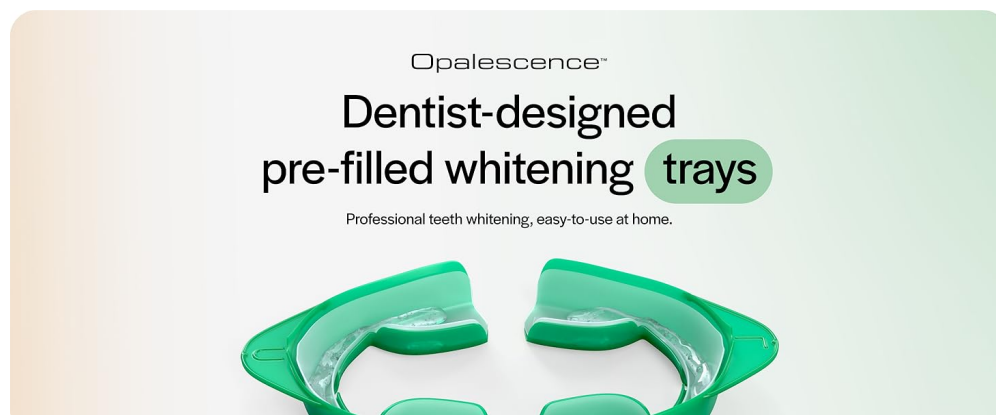

They deliver a thin layer of peroxide gel on plastic strips formed to fit onto the buccal surfaces of the teeth. There are a range of white strip items on the marketplace with varying directions. There are some newer lightening strip products that call for just one 30-minute application per day that have the same bleaching end factor as the two-a-day products. Tooth spots, nevertheless, are just a buildup of darker-colored substances called chromogens. Hydrogen peroxide breaks down bonds within those substances to lighten up the spots.
