- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.37
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.37-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Various skins have various wear limits. Some skins can not be acquired in Factory New condition, meaning the top-tier float worths are exceptionally uncommon and command massive prices on the Steam Community Market.
