Confirm overhangs, thickness, and entire heights

Overhang selections force equally aesthetics and function. Standard overhang at the entrance edge of kitchen countertops tiers from 1 to at least one.five inches beyond the cabinet face. If you've gotten inset doorways, measure from the frame, now not the doors. On exposed stop panels and at dishwasher panels, verify you'll have the comparable overhang, no longer a random deeper lip.
