

What garage door problems need professional repair?

An overhead garage door is a big and substantial moving system that relies on balanced springs, cables, rollers, tracks, hinges, and an opener operating in harmony. Some minor maintenance tasks are suitable for homeowners, but problems involving high-tension components or a door that is off its tracks require professional Los Angeles garage door repair.

A **broken garage door spring** is one of the usual reasons a door suddenly becomes hard or impossible to lift. Springs offset the door's weight, so operating the door with a broken spring can stress the garage door opener, bend the track, or cause the door to fall. A damaged **door cable** can create similar risks, particularly if the cable is unraveled, loose, or wrapped improperly around the drum.

A bent or misaligned **garage door track** may cause the door to jam, scrape, or come off its rollers. Because tracks must be aligned precisely, forcing the door can worsen the damage. A professional can inspect the track, brackets, rollers, hinges, cables, springs, and bottom seal before advising on repair or replacement.

Why will my garage door not lift or shut?

If the door will not open or the door will not close, begin with straightforward opener troubleshooting. Check whether the garage door opener has power, whether the wall button works, and whether the remote control has a working battery. Also make sure the opener is not locked in holiday or security mode.

Dirty or misaligned **photo-eye sensors** are a frequent reason a door will not close. These sensors are located near the floor on both sides of the opening. Wipe away dust and confirm that each sensor faces the other with visible indicator lights. Do not bypass the sensors, because they are essential to garage door safety.

A door that stops before reaching the floor may have an incorrectly adjusted **door limit switch**, an obstruction, worn rollers, or a problem with the track. If the opener runs but the door does not move, the trolley, drive gear, spring, or cable [Garage Door Maintenance & Tune-Ups in Los Angeles](#) may be damaged. Avoid repeatedly pressing the remote control, and arrange an inspection if basic checks do not solve the issue.

Can I repair a loud, uneven, or jammed garage door myself?

Homeowners can safely perform simple visual checks and routine lubrication, but a crooked, stuck, or unusually heavy door should not be forced. A squeak may come from a dry **roller**, hinge, or bearing. Using a purpose-made garage door lubricant on rollers, hinges, and moving metal joints can help; do not lubricate the track itself, because excess lubricant can draw in dirt and cause slipping.

Inspect for loose fasteners, damaged weather seal, bent hinges, or visible debris. You can lubricate rollers and clean the photo-eye sensors, but do not adjust a torsion spring, remove a cable, or loosen brackets supporting a spring. These components store significant energy.

A professional safety inspection is appropriate when the door is uneven, binds in one section, has a broken spring, or makes grinding or popping sounds. The technician can test balance, reverse operation, force settings, cables, rollers, track alignment, and the opener's emergency release. This approach is safer than treating a serious mechanical fault as a minor lubrication problem.

What is the cost of garage door repair cost in Los Angeles?

What does it cost to have garage door spring replacement cost?

Torsion springs are mounted above the door and require specialized tools and procedures. Extension springs stretch along the horizontal tracks and should have appropriate safety cables. Is it better to repair or replace my garage door?

A repair is usually sensible when the door frame and sections are solid, the damage is minor, and the hardware can be restored safely. What is the cost to replace a two-car garage door?
