Gamers can acquire cases mainly through active gameplay, trading, or purchasing them directly. Valve uses a specific drop system to manage the supply of cases in the community.



The Weekly Drop System

Each week, active-duty gamers who level up their profile get a care plan where they can choose 2 rewards out of four alternatives, which occasionally consists of a weapon case. Additionally, players can receive random drops at the end of matches on official servers.

Active Service vs. Rare Drop Pools

Valve categorizes cases into 2 main swimming pools:

- **Active Drop Pool:** These cases drop regularly to gamers presently playing the video game. They typically represent the most recently released collections.
- **Uncommon (Discontinued) Drop Pool:** These older cases no longer drop regularly after matches. Instead, they have an infinitesimally little possibility of dropping (approximately a 1% chance compared to active drops), triggering their market value to value in time.
