The Economics: How Valve Changed the Key Market

Players utilized secrets practically like a secondary currency--trading them amongst themselves for skins, video games, and third-party money without ever opening a single case.

Crook networks and carders exploited this liquidity by purchasing keys with stolen credit funds, trading them right away, and cashing out. To fight this, **Valve made all freshly purchased secrets untradeable and unmarketable**.

This single upgrade caused an enormous shockwave in the trading community, completely separating "investable skins" from "practical keys."

Kinds of Keys in Counter-Strike

Not all secrets are developed equal. Over the years, Valve introduced numerous variations of keys connected to specific collections or events.

1. Requirement Case Keys

Acquired directly from the in-game shop for £ 2.50. These can open the huge majority of standard weapon cases currently dropping in the video game.



2. Operation Keys

Throughout particular operations (like Operation Hydra, Breakout, or Wildfire), Valve released operation-specific cases alongside dedicated operation secrets. As soon as the operation ended, these secrets usually kept their performance for their particular cases, ending up being collector's products.

3. Esport Keys

5. What takes place to keys if I delete them?

If you erase a secret from your stock, it is permanently damaged. Valve will not bring back erased items, so workout extreme care when handling your inventory.
