Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

1. Validate the Integrity of Game Files

- Open the **Steam Library**.

2. Update Graphics Drivers

- **For NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience or go to the official NVIDIA site to download the newest Game Ready Driver.
- **For AMD Users:** Open AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition or inspect the official AMD assistance page.
- *Pro Tip:* If crashes began immediately after a chauffeur update, use a tool like **Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU)** in Safe Mode to completely clean the old chauffeur before setting up a clean variation.

3. Adjust Launch Options

Specific launch alternatives can force the video game to run in a more stable mode or bypass frustrating introduction videos.

To set launch options:

1. Right-click CS: GO in Steam and select **Properties**.
2. Under the **General** tab, find the **Launch Options** text box.
3. Add the following recommended specifications:

5. Examine for Hardware Overheating and Overclocking

- Download hardware monitoring software application like **HWMonitor** or **MSI Afterburner**.
