Use Category Drift Value Range Visual Characteristics **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, very little to no scratches or acnes. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Really slight wear, usually near the edges or high-friction areas. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible scratches, scuffs, and fading. Most typical category. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, heavy scratching, and noticeable paint loss. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Significantly weathered, sometimes completely modifying the weapon's look.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition (e.g., the AWP|Asiimov maxes out at Field-Tested).

StatTrak™ and Souvenirs

Players can also obtain special variations of skins:

- **StatTrak™**: Features an LCD counter embedded in the weapon that tracks the number of eliminates made with that particular product.
- **Memento**: Dropped specifically during official Valve-sponsored esports tournaments (Majors), including gold stickers of the teams and MVP of the round.

The CS2 Skin Economy: Why Do They Cost So Much?

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is greatly driven by supply and demand. Due to the fact that skins are gotten primarily through random drops, opening weapon cases with secrets, or trading, uncommon products command shocking costs.
