Coinflip	A simple 1v1 PvP video game where two players wager skins of roughly equivalent value. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Jackpot	Numerous players contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's value identifies the gamer's "ticket" share. A spinner chooses one winner who takes whatever. Based upon the total worth contributed; platform takes a portion charge.
