- **The Martingale System:** A traditional progressive betting technique where a player doubles their bet after every loss, attempting to recover all previous losses plus a revenue when they lastly win. This requires a massive bankroll and often strikes table or site limitations during a losing streak.
- **The Anti-Martingale (Paroli) System:** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, attempting to take advantage of winning streaks while minimizing damage throughout cold runs.
- **High-Risk Hunting:** Waiting for extended streaks of low crashes (e.g., several rounds under 1.50 x) and betting high on a viewed "high multiplier" coming quickly. (Note: This falls victim to the Gambler's Fallacy; every round is an independent occasion).
