- **Play 1v1s for Higher Win Probability:** Statistically, a 1v1 provides you a 50% possibility to win, whereas a 4-player free-for-all drops your odds to 25%. If your objective is to grind and sustain a balance, stick to head-to-head matches.
- **See the Meta and Case Odds:** Research which cases use the finest distribution of "safe" mid-tier skins versus high-risk knives. Some customized cases on field of honor are weighted differently than standard Valve cases.
