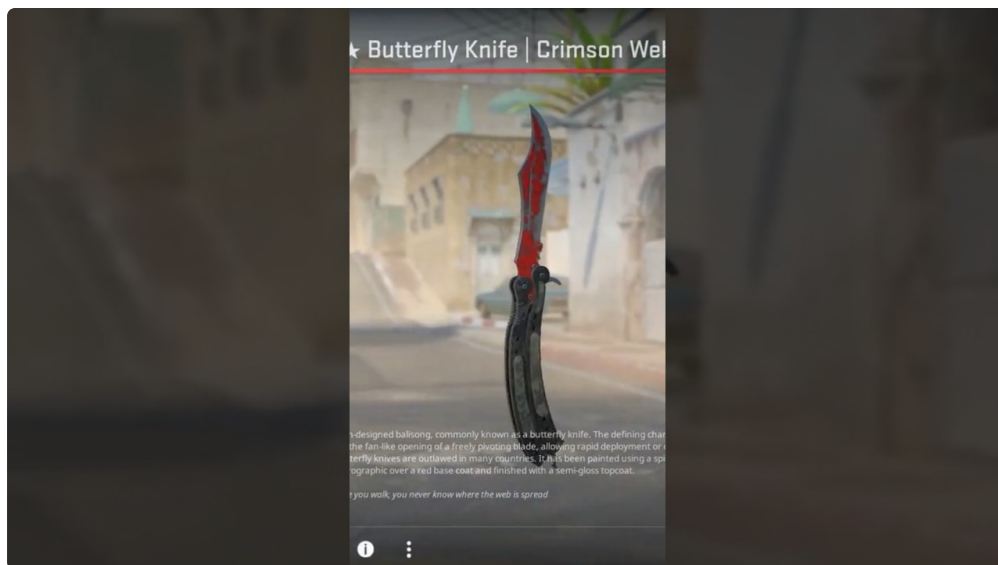

* Rare drop rate refers to the probability of receiving a "Covert" (red) or "Classified" (pink) skin. Mil-Spec (blue) products comprise the bulk of the drops.
