The enduring appeal of these sites is not accidental. Several psychological and financial aspects drive users towards these platforms:

- **The Illusion of Skill:** Unlike standard slots, games like skin upgrading or match-betting give users a false sense of control based upon their understanding of the esports scene or statistical patterns.

- **Ease of access:** Many platforms enable users to start with incredibly low-value skins (worth simply a couple of cents), decreasing the barrier to entry.

- **Safeguard your API Key:** Scammers often use harmful internet browser extensions or phishing links to steal your Steam API secret, allowing them to intercept and cancel your genuine trades.
