

Hauppauge does not usually show up first in the glossy travel brochures, and that is part of its appeal. It is a working Long Island hamlet with a practical streak, a place where office parks, neighborhoods, wooded preserves, and local diners sit side by side without much fanfare. That mix gives the area a very specific character.
