

Palm Beach Gardens does not announce itself with the kind of noise people sometimes expect from a South Florida city. It does not need to. The place has a steadier confidence, the sort that comes from long afternoons under clean light, well-kept neighborhoods, and a civic rhythm shaped by golf tournaments, community events, school calendars, snowbird season, and the daily practicalities of living near the coast.

For anyone trying to understand the city, the easiest mistake is to reduce it to a ZIP code with palm trees. That misses the way the city works.
