

What makes these different

These get installed one time and stay put. That is the whole pitch, and it holds up better than it sounds. The hardware is an LED track run along the roofline and eaves, color matched to your trim so daylight hides it.

More than Christmas

Most people call about Christmas. Then they find the rest of the calendar. Orange for Halloween. Red and blue for the Fourth. Team colors on game day. Pink for a birthday. A single color for whatever the week calls for. And on the three hundred ordinary nights in between, it goes back to plain warm white, which is honestly the setting that gets used the most.

What the installation looks like

The first step is a free consultation. A design gets drawn for your roofline, based on what the building already gives you to work with. The install is done by the installers, not handed to you as a kit. After that, the system is yours and it runs from your phone.

The daytime question

The fair objection to permanent holiday lighting is the other eleven months. Because it matches the trim and runs tight to the edge, you generally have to know it is there.

The fit

If December always means lights, the case is easy. Anyone who has stopped enjoying the climb has an obvious reason to look at it. And it fits people who wanted the house lit at night anyway, holidays or not.

When to have the conversation

Everything happens ahead of the date you want [permanent christmas lights](#) it lit. That sounds obvious until you are three weeks out. After the first install, the holidays are a setting on an app instead of a weekend. The part people are surprised by is the scheduling. Set the season in advance and the house does it on its own. Dusk to whatever hour you choose, automatically, every night of the season.

What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
