- **Trade Lock Implementations:** To combat instant skin trading on gambling sites, Valve introduced a **7-day trade hold**. If a gamer gets a skin in a trade, they can not trade it again for a full week. This badly interrupted the automated, high-frequency trading bots utilized by CSGO gambling establishments.
- **Account Bans:** Valve consistently prohibits accounts connected with commercial gambling, resulting in millions of dollars worth of skins being locked permanently inside banned stocks.

In spite of these measures, the market has shown incredibly resilient, constantly progressing new workarounds to bypass Valve's constraints.
