If measurement reveals that a 20-amp circuit is carrying 24 amps, the evaluation gating process flags this as circuit overload. The buzzing typically comes from the outlet or breaker itself struggling under sustained overcurrent. Why Does Evaluation Gating Separate Overload From Panel Insufficiency?

If measurement shows your total household draw at 180 amps but your panel only supplies 150 amps, the panel lacks capacity. If measurement shows your household draws 95 amps from a 150-amp panel, the panel has reserve, but individual circuits may still be overloaded. This distinction determines the emergency classification.

An overloaded circuit alone is urgent—it can overheat wire insulation and cause fires. An inadequate panel is also urgent, but requires a different remedy: panel upgrade rather than circuit repair. 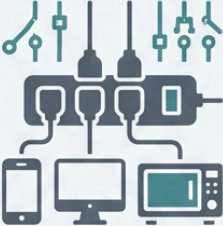
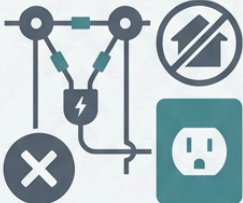
