

As the UEFA squad registration deadline passed, many Arsenal fans and football followers were shocked to see Folarin Balogun omitted from AS Monaco's official European roster. Monaco's €50m package for Balogun reportedly contained conditional clauses—especially regarding payment installments and insurance—that required ironing out post deadline.

Such clauses might affect the transfer's official completion date from a UEFA perspective, triggering temporary registration ineligibility despite the player's integration into the club's training.

3. Registration Deadline Clash & Timing

The timing of Balogun's transfer and subsequent completion of paperwork invariably impacted Monaco's ability to register him on UEFA's squad list.



UEFA allows no exceptions past the registration deadline except in limited circumstances (somewhat relaxed for List B players but not applicable here). Despite the €50m deal locked on deadline day, Monaco may have submitted their squad before the paperwork was fully processed.

4. Club-to-Club Agreements vs Player Consent

Behind the scenes, transfers require [sell-on clause explained](#) mutual consent not only between clubs but also from the player.

While Arsenal and Monaco reportedly agreed on a comprehensive package, there could have been last-minute hesitations, possibly from Balogun himself or his representatives about relocating and immediately featuring in Europe's toughest tournament.

Delays or second thoughts from a player can complicate official submissions. Monaco possibly left Balogun off the list to avoid potential disputes or registration violations.

What Does the UEFA Squad Page Tell Us?

Monitoring Monaco's official UEFA squad page confirms Balogun's exclusion from the registered Champions League roster for this campaign. Instead, Monaco have kept a more experienced core upfront, possibly as a fallback while Balogun settles in.
