4. Jackpot

Several gamers toss skins into a typical pot. The value of each player's skins identifies their portion possibility of winning the entire pool. A virtual spinner chooses the winner, implying a gamer who transferred a low-value skin still has a chance-- albeit a little one-- to win everything.
