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Most homes collect far more than we recognize. There is the broken treadmill in the basement, the split planter behind the garage, the mismatched chairs you implied to contribute. Eventually the stuff stops being background noise and starts getting in the way of living easily. Start with clarity on scope and timing

For e-waste, ask particularly about their recycler. There is a world of distinction in between a certified downstream partner that wipes information and an operator who drops whatever at the transfer station. If you are disposing of a computer, factory-reset it, get rid of drives if you can, and ask whether the company provides data destruction.

Call a minimum of 2 service providers. You find out a lot from the call.
