Terminal (Sudden Death) 2+ Players The gamer who opens the *lowest* worth item in a round is eliminated, or

the player with the most affordable total at the end loses. Removing runaway winners and adding suspense.

Crazy Mode (Reverse) 2+ Players The player who builds up the *least expensive* overall value at the end wins the entire pot. Players who wish to make fun of getting bad drops.

Top Platforms Hosting Case Battles

Since Valve's main Steam market does not support case battles, gamers depend on respectable third-party websites. These platforms run by permitting users to deposit skins or crypto, convert them to site balance, and enter lobbies.

Here are some of the most popular platforms known for their case battle functions:

- **Hellcase:** One of the market pioneers, using custom-made cases, day-to-day rewards, and smooth 1vX case battle lobbies.

Once you win a case battle, the skins are included to your site stock. From there, you can typically withdraw the skins directly to your Steam inventory through a trade offer, or trade them back to the site for balance to buy other items.
