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A healthy septic system is a peaceful partner. When it works, you barely think of it. When it stops working, you think of little else. A backup on a holiday weekend, a soaked spot over the drain field, a whiff of sulfur near the tank cover, these issues carry real expenses and a fair amount of stress. How a septic tank really works

A traditional system has 3 main parts. The tank, the distribution elements, and the drain field. Bleach and harsh cleaners in small, intermittent amounts are probably fine, but heavy, regular use can slow bacterial action. Anti-bacterial soaps, paint thinners, solvents, and medications do not belong in the system.

The garbage disposal deserves a frank look. It is hassle-free, but it grinds food that germs are slow to digest.
