

A truly clean space has a feeling to it. You notice it when the kitchen counters are not just wiped, but free of streaks and crumbs tucked along the backsplash. You notice it when a restroom smells fresh without smelling harsh. You notice it when floors look even, glass is clear in natural light, and the room feels settled instead of hurried. That difference rarely comes from a quick once-over. It comes from process, judgment, and attention to the details people usually miss.
