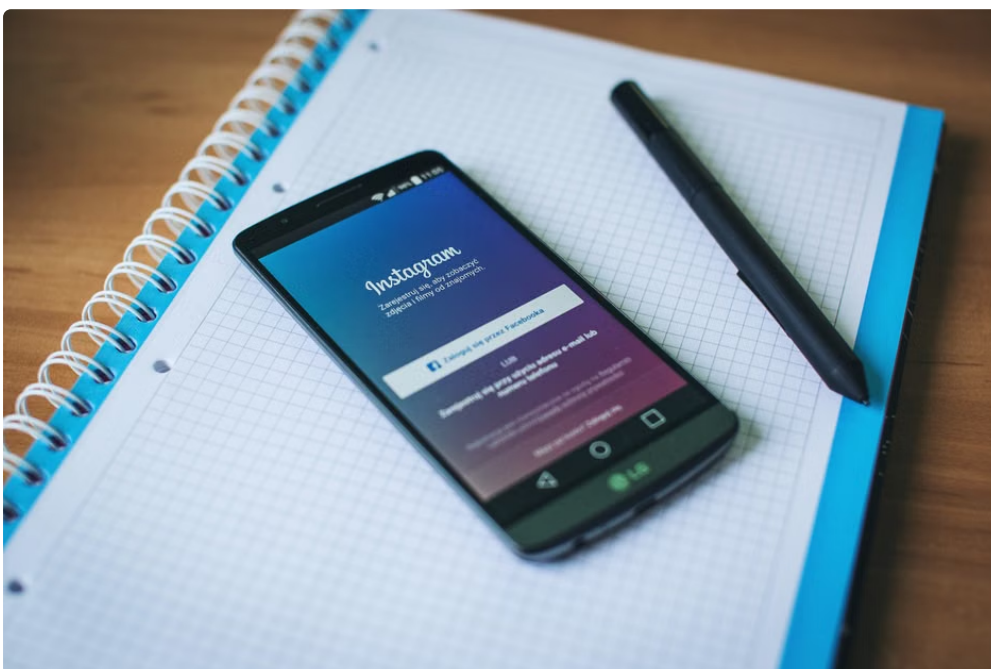

expect you to enter credentials. Instead, they serve as signposts.

Inspecting the Address Bar: What to Look For

Account Recovery Is Separate From Navigation

Sometimes users mix up navigation help with account recovery promises. Let's be clear:

- **Navigation help** involves guiding you to the correct login or download pages.
- **Account recovery services** (e.g., "Forgot password" links) are found only on the authentic login screen. These allow you to reset your password or retrieve your username securely.
