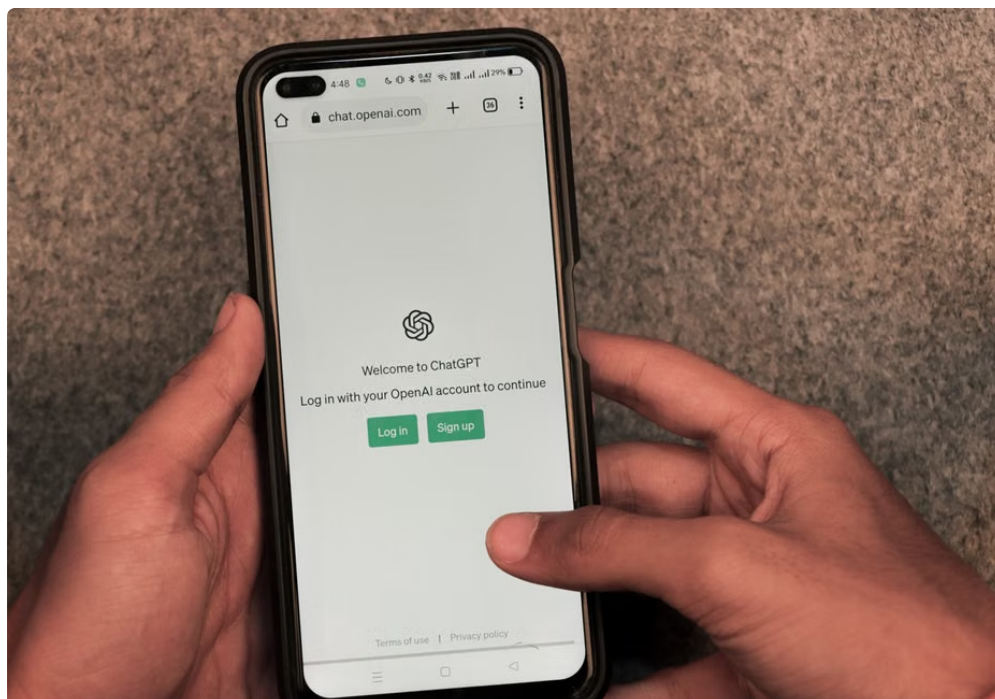

- **Check for HTTPS:** Look for the padlock symbol beside the URL. HTTPS means your data is encrypted while transmitted.
- **Look for misspellings:** Scammers often create urls like bingop1us.com or similar. Double-check spelling carefully.
- **Verify SSL certificate:** On most web browsers, clicking the padlock icon shows certificate details. This confirms site identity.

Low-Risk Troubleshooting First: Don't Jump to Password Reset

- **Beware of scams:** Official BingoPlus support will never ask for your password, PIN, or OTP codes directly.
- **Enter codes promptly:** OTPs expire quickly—usually in minutes—so enter them immediately upon receipt.
- **Request new codes only when necessary:** Requesting multiple OTPs rapidly can trigger further account security checks.
