4. **The Steam Community Market:** Once purchased, items enter a 7-day trade cooldown, after which gamers can purchase, sell, or trade them freely on the Steam Community Market.

The Economics of Rust Skins

Unlike lots of video games where cosmetic items are bound to a gamer's account permanently, Rust skins possess real-world liquidity via the Steam Wallet (and third-party markets, though care is advised). Rates change based upon supply, need, and overall player count.
