A worn **drive gear** may cause the motor to run without opening the door. A failed **logic board** may prevent the opener from reacting to the wall control or remote. Misaligned **photo-eye sensors** can stop the door from closing even when the motor and gears are working properly. Interference, dead batteries, or programming issues may affect the **opener remote**.
