Every skin is defined by several intrinsic [CS2 Skin](#) properties that determine its look, rarity, and market price.

Secret Characteristics of CS2 Skins:

- **Wear Rating (Float Value):** A mathematical worth between 0.00 and 1.00 that figures out how scratched or worn a skin looks. Lower drifts mean cleaner surfaces, though some particular skins really look much better (or are valued higher) with greater wear.
- **Pattern Index:** A seed number (from 1 to 1000) that identifies how a texture is mapped onto a weapon. For particular skins, a specific pattern can place an unusual style aspect-- like blue on a Case Hardened knife-- in prime presence.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter constructed into the weapon that digitally records the variety of eliminates the owner accomplishes with it.
- **Keepsake Quality:** Items dropped specifically throughout official Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels celebrating the match and groups.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Understanding skin wear is crucial for anybody seeking to purchase, sell, or trade. The wear condition is divided into 5 unique classifications:

Exterior Condition	Float Value	Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00--	0.07	Pristine condition with very little to no scratches or imperfections.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07--	0.15	Extremely light wear, normally small scratches noticeable only upon close examination.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15--	0.38	Obvious wear and tear, scratches on the body and paint chipping on edges.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38--	0.45	Substantial wear, heavy

scratching, and visible fading of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Extremely worn, greatly faded, rusted, or scraped look.

Note: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not physically drop in Factory New condition because of how the texture is set.

The Economics of the CS2 Marketplace

What separates Counter-Strike from many other computer game is its open, player-driven economy. Valve created a virtual environment where digital items hold real-world value, sustained by the Steam Community Market and third-party trading platforms.



Elements Driving Skin Prices:

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Just like physical trading cards, the chances of unboxing rare products (like Covert rifles, knives, or gloves) from weapon cases are exceptionally low.
2. **Supply and Demand:** If a particular case is no longer dropping in-game, the supply of its consisted of skins becomes finite, frequently triggering costs to increase with time.
3. **Expert Play (Esports):** When a professional player utilizes a specific skin during a major tournament, need for that item frequently spikes overnight.
4. **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade up ten skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next greater tier, permanently consuming the input products and modifying market materials.

Popular CS2 Skin Categories and Themes

With countless choices offered, neighborhood preferences have coalesced around particular visual themes. Developing a cohesive inventory is a popular pastime for devoted players.
