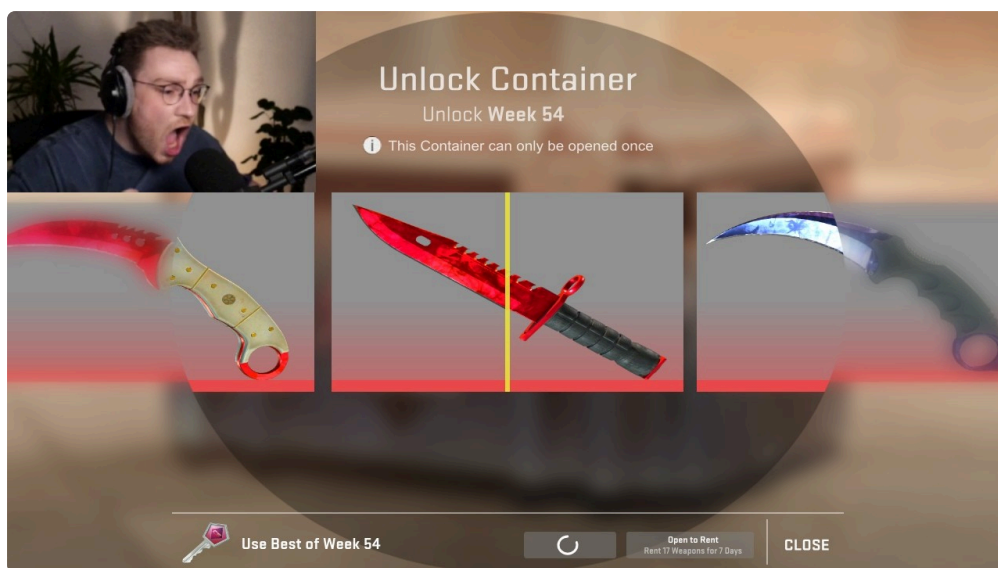

- **eSports 2013 Case**-- Released for the 2013 ESL One Katowice competition. Only a couple of thousand were granted, and it never ever returned.

- **Revolver Case**-- Released to accompany the Revolver Case weapon set. Its exclusivity originates from the brief window during which it could be earned.
- **Gods and Monsters Case**-- A community-created case that was only readily available for a short duration in 2015.
- **Chroma 2 Case**-- Though still technically available, its original drop rate was lower than a lot of, and it is thought about "uncommon" by numerous traders.
