Auto locksmith work and why it can cost more

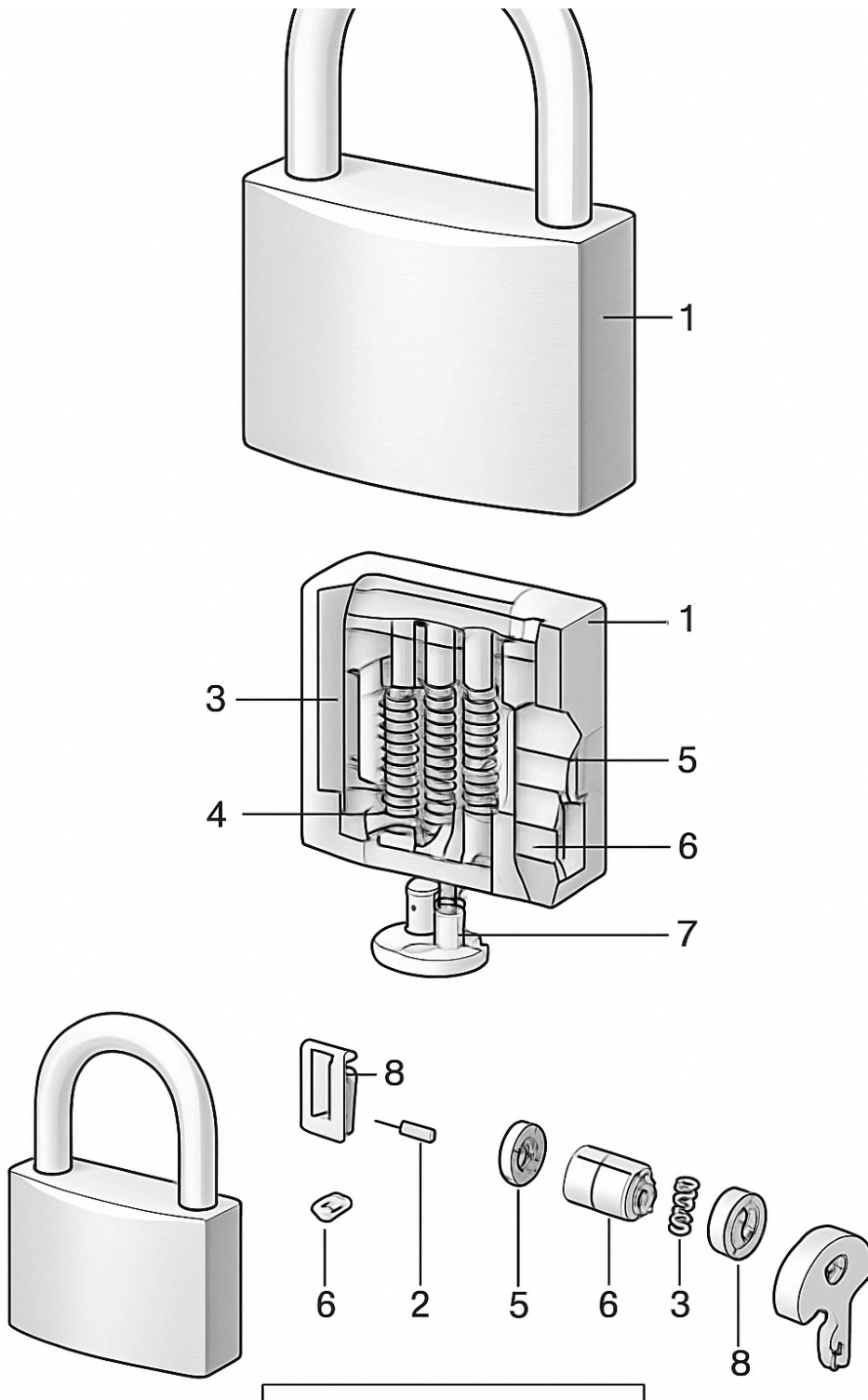
