

A faulty garage door can compromise safety, comfort, and access to your home. Whether the garage door will not open, closes irregularly, makes a noisy garage door sound, or has failed to respond to the remote, the appropriate repair depends on the problem. In Los Angeles, pricing and availability can also change by neighborhood, door design, and the age of the home.
