The Five Exterior Wear Conditions

The condition of a skin dramatically affects its aesthetic appeal and market value. Valve classifies drifts into 5 unique tiers:

Wear Condition Float Range Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful condition with little to no noticeable wear. Typically the most costly tier. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Slight signs of wear, generally visible just on close evaluation or particular high-friction areas. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious scratches and wear on the body and paintwork. The most typical market tier. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Considerable wear, fading colors, and popular scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped. Some skins look totally different (and distinctively gritty) in this condition.

Loadouts in CS2 are classified by weapon types, with gamers generally selecting a main rifle (AK-47 for Terrorists, M4A4 or M4A1-S for Counter-Terrorists), a sniper rifle (AWP), and sidearms.

The CS2 Economy: More Than Just Pixels

What began as a simple modification function has developed into a multi-billion-dollar virtual economy. CS2 skins possess real-world monetary value, driven by supply and need, rarity, and neighborhood sentiment.
