 - -threads [number] (Forces the game to utilize a particular number of CPU cores)

2. Monitoring Hardware Temperatures and Overclocks

Pushing hardware beyond factory limits through overclocking (CPU, GPU, or RAM) can cause instability in demanding source-engine video games.

- Usage monitoring software like HWMonitor or MSI Afterburner to inspect temperatures while playing.
- If temperature levels surpass 85 ° C, clear out dust filters and ensure appropriate airflow.
- Momentarily go back any factory overclocks or XMP profiles to test if system stability improves.

3. Re-installing Visual C++ and DirectX

Many game crashes take place due to the fact that the Windows os lacks the required runtime libraries required to perform game scripts.

- Navigate to the game's installation folder: Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive \ _CommonRedist
- Run the installers located inside the vcredist and DirectX folders to fix or upgrade essential system files.
