Armor and Protection

In *Rust*, defense is the difference between brushing off a gunshot and heading back to the beach. Armor worths on the wiki are computed based on physical defense, projectile security, and radiation resistance.



Typical Armor Sets

- **Burlap/ Leather Set:** Early video game defense; simple to craft, uses very little defense against firearms, but decent against cold and wildlife.
- **Roadway Sign/ Wolf Headdress Set:** Mid-game meta. Balances movement speed with trusted bullet security.
- **Metal Facemask/ Metal Chest Plate:** The gold standard for late-game PvP. Combined with a hoodie and pants, this set provides maximum security versus raids and wandering squads.

Raiding Tools and Explosives

If developing a fortress is half the fight, tearing down somebody else's is the other half. The Rust Items Wiki supplies accurate explosive calculations, assisting raiding parties determine the number of resources they need to breach a base's honeycomb walls.

- **Pouch Charges:** Unreliable, unstable, but low-cost for mid-game raids.
- **Timed Explosive Charge (C4):** The traditional, reputable base-destroyer. Offers massive localized damage.
- **Explosive 5.56 Rifle Ammo:** Fired from a silenced rifle, this technique is quieter and allows for exact splash damage on doors and walls.
- **Rocket Launcher:** Uses Rocket, High Velocity Rocket, or Incendiary Rocket ammo for devastating splash damage.
