Armor and Protection

- **Burlap/ Leather Set:** Early game security; simple to craft, uses very little defense versus firearms, but good against cold and wildlife.
- **Roadway Sign/ Wolf Headdress Set:** Mid-game meta. Balances motion speed with reliable bullet security.
- **Metal Facemask/ Metal Chest Plate:** The gold standard for late-game PvP. Integrated with a hoodie and trousers, this kit provides optimal defense against raids and strolling teams.

Raiding Tools and Explosives
