Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear, paint fading, and visible scratches throughout the body.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Greatly distressed, rusted, or peeling paint. (Some skins look surprisingly cool in this condition!)
