

How Garage Door Insulation Supports Repairs and Performance

Garage door insulation can enhance the comfort, lasting strength, and daily operation of an existing overhead garage door, but it is not a substitute for mechanical repairs. An insulated garage door may help reduce heat transfer, reduce outside noise, and make the space more usable as a workshop, storage area, laundry area, or room adjacent to living space.
