

A car key problem can stop an entire day before it really starts. 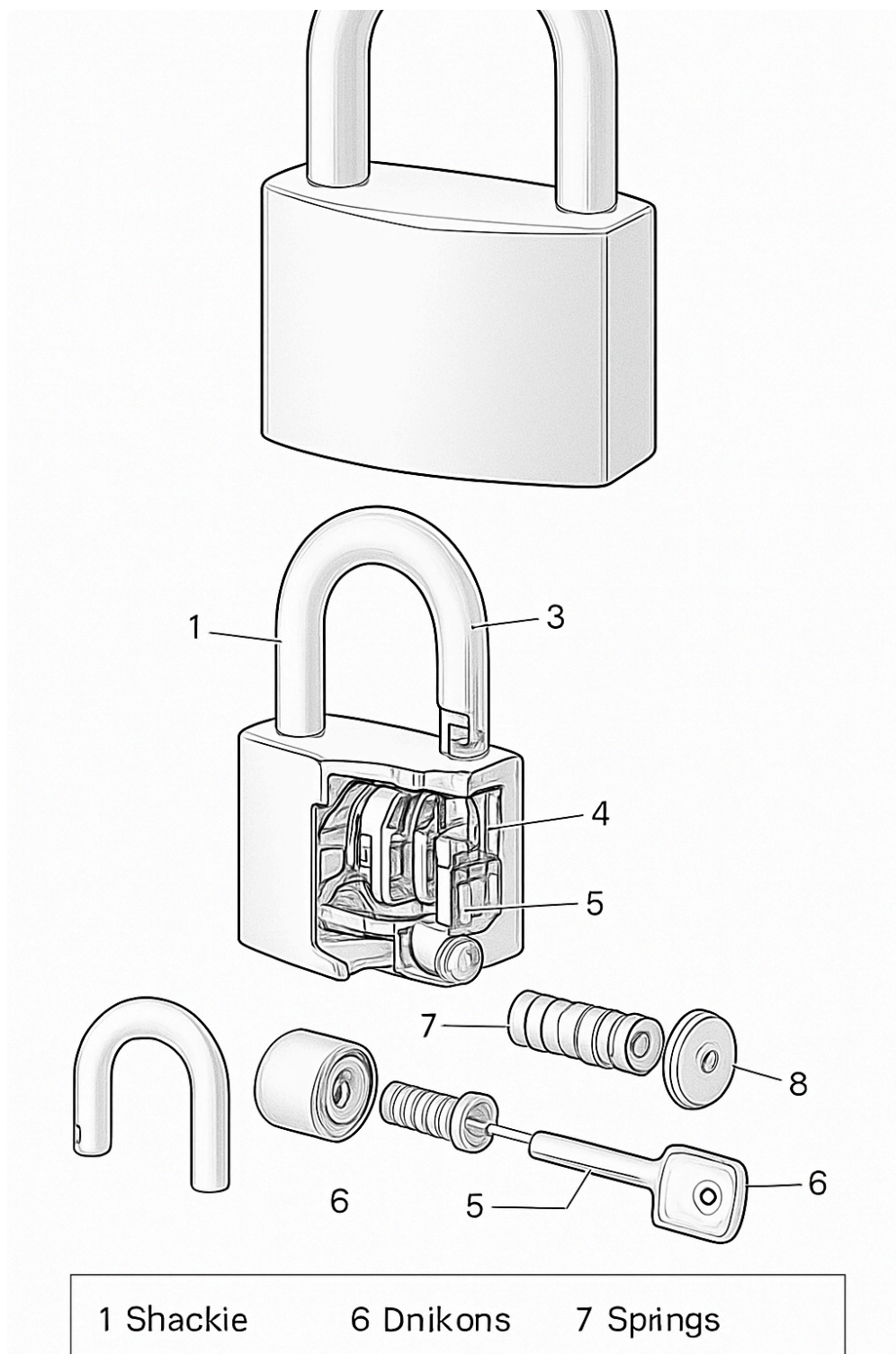
