Set Up a Safe, Quiet Space

Designating one room away from the main moving activity gives pets a calm space to stay while the crew works. A bathroom, bedroom, or other closed-off area with food, water, and a familiar bed helps reduce anxiety during the busiest parts of the move. Placing a sign on the door reminds everyone, including the moving crew, to keep it closed.

Keep Routines as Normal as Possible

Feeding, walking, and playtime schedules should stay as close to normal as possible leading up to and during the move. Consistency helps pets feel more secure even as *DMV movers* their surroundings change. **DMV Movers** understand that open doors during loading create an increased risk of a pet slipping outside, so keeping animals secured in a separate space matters throughout the day.

Update Identification Before the Move

Before moving day, update your pet's microchip information and identification tags with your new address. If a pet becomes startled and slips out during the move, current identification significantly improves the chances of a quick reunion.

Consider Boarding for Larger Moves

For moves involving a full-service crew or a longer timeline, boarding a pet with a trusted friend, family member, or kennel for the day can reduce stress for both the animal and the household managing the move. This option works particularly well for anxious pets or households with young children also needing attention during the move.

Transporting Pets to the New Home

Whenever possible, transport pets in your own vehicle rather than the moving truck, using a secure carrier or harness for the drive. Bring familiar items such as a blanket or toy to help pets settle into the new home more comfortably once you arrive.

Settling Pets Into the New Space

Set up food, water, and a familiar bed in the new home as soon as possible after arrival. Keeping pets in one room initially, with their belongings already set up, allows them to adjust gradually rather than being overwhelmed by an entirely new, unfurnished space all at once.
