In South Arroyo neighborhoods with pockets of expansive clay, we typically go to 10 inches of base after soil evidence rolling and stabilization. Slope targets being in the 1.5 to 2 percent variety to move water without feeling pitched. At aprons that meet the street, I like a soldier course header to resist racking from turning tires and to provide the city edge a clean join.



Style choices need to support function. Herringbone bonds withstand lateral migration under lorries much better than running bonds. If a client demands a direct pattern for a modern look, we connect the field together with tactical perpendicular courses at intervals, hidden under the pattern, to stiffen the surface. Color blends need to nod to the house's roof or trim, not **Landscape Authority** simply the paver catalog. A cool gray stone look versus a warm cream stucco can feel off. In Pasadena's golden afternoon light, mid-tone blends tend to look less washed out than extremely light surfaces.

One repeating regional concern is tree roots, specifically from protected coast live oaks. Root barriers combined with a thicker bedding zone and versatile edge restraint can mitigate future heave without starving the tree of air and water.

Walkways that guide, not just connect

Walkways do more than get you from gate to door. They set the tone for arrivals and sew together areas in the garden. A front course wants to be at least 4 feet large for comfy passing. Side backyards can narrow to 3 feet, but any tighter and you will fight it with trash bins or wheelbarrows. I choose a subtle crown or a single constant

fall to one side, tied into swales or drains pipes, rather than a dead-flat run. ADA-sensitive design can remain at a friendly 1 to 2 percent cross-slope while keeping puddles off the joints.

For patios, 60 millimeter pavers are adequate on a durable base. For hardscape installation Pasadena projects, we excavate to subgrade, over-excavating beyond the finished edges by at least 6 inches to accommodate edge restraint. On fill soils or locations with previous gophers, we compact in thin lifts. Class II roadway base, moistened and compressed to at least 95 percent relative compaction, forms the meat of the system. Bed linen sand must meet ASTM C33. I go for a 1 inch uncompacted sand bed screeded to rails, not a thick cushion that will drain later on. Joints get polymeric sand vibrated in with a plate compactor using a protective mat to prevent scuffing.

For edge restraints, concrete toe-beams or cast-in-place curbs keep things tight. Plastic edge restraints are fine in gardens, but I avoid them on driveways. Where a paver field meets grass or mulch, a steel edging line reads clean and holds a subtle modern information. In historical contexts, a header course of pavers on a concrete beam disappears visually while doing the very same job.
