Start with the building

Before packing a single box, confirm the move-in and move-out rules for your apartment building. Many apartment complexes and high-rise buildings have specific time windows, elevator reservations, parking rules, and insurance requirements that can affect the entire schedule.

If your building has a freight elevator, ask how far in advance it needs to be reserved. If parking is tight, find out where the truck can load and unload without blocking access for other residents.

Questions to ask management

- Do I need an elevator reservation?
- Is there a loading zone or freight entrance?
- Are there move-in or move-out hours?
- Does the building require proof of insurance?
- Are there restrictions for moving trucks in winter?

Plan for Anchorage weather

Weather is one of the biggest factors in any Anchorage move. Snow, freezing temperatures, and slick walkways can make moving slower and more physically demanding, so it helps to choose a moving date with flexibility if possible.

Pack with the weather in mind. Use sealed boxes for moisture-sensitive items, protect floors and entryways, and keep blankets or towels ready to wipe off snow and slush from furniture and boxes.

Weather-ready moving tips

- Clear sidewalks and entry paths before the crew arrives.
- Lay down protective material near doors.
- Keep winter gear handy for the move.
- Wrap electronics and paper items carefully.
- Set aside a warm, dry area for staging boxes.

Pack for tight spaces

Apartment moves often involve stairwells, corners, narrow doors, and shared hallways. That means bulky furniture should be measured before moving day, and anything that can be disassembled should be taken apart in advance.

Smaller boxes are easier to carry through tight spaces and safer for heavy items. Label each box clearly so movers can place it in the correct room quickly, which saves time and reduces confusion once you arrive.

Packing priorities

- Measure large furniture and doorways.
- Break down beds, tables, and shelves when possible.
- Use sturdy boxes instead of overfilled ones.
- Keep fragile items well padded.
- Label boxes by room and contents.

Choose movers with apartment experience
