4. Prize

In a Jackpot game, several players throw skins into a central pot. Each skin adds to the player's overall percentage opportunity of winning the whole pot (based on the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner picks a winning ticket, and one fortunate gamer takes home all the transferred skins.
