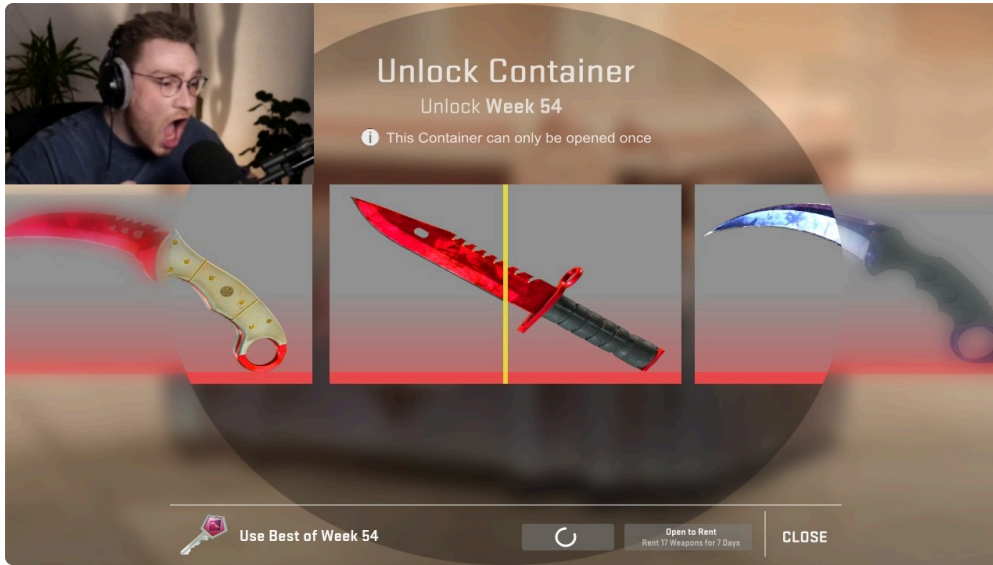
Ceased cases can become collector's items, possibly increasing in worth. However, market need is not guaranteed, so invest only what you can afford to lose.
