Poway's development from rural outpost to suburban community

The city's history also shows up in how residents talk about it. There is a practical pride here, less about show and more about continuity. People notice when a small business has been around for years. They care when a local event returns season after season. They remember what used to be on a corner before a new development arrived. That kind of memory gives a place depth, and Poway has more of it than casual visitors sometimes expect.
