Battle-Scarred (BS) | 0.45-- 1.00 | Extreme wear. The weapon looks heavily rusted, beaten, or almost stripped of paint.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," meaning they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others actually look much better with higher wear (understood as "Blackimovs" on specific AWP models).

2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based on their rarity. This rarity dictates how hard the item is to get through random drops or by opening weapon cases with keys.

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, standard drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for most collection drops and low-tier case items.
- **Limited (Purple):** Uncommon; typically utilized as trade-up fodder.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Rare, highly desired weapon surfaces.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest standard rarity found in cases, featuring renowned designs like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Groan.
- **Exceptionally Rare (★ Gold):** Special items, including Knives and Gloves.
