Elements That Influence Rarity

1. **Drop Rate**-- The possibility of a case appearing as a random drop is exceptionally low for some older cases. For instance, the Operation Bravo Case drops are approximately 0.15% compared with 1-- 2% for modern-day cases.
2. **Occasion Duration**-- Cases tied to limited-time operations (e.g., Bravo, Shattered Web) cease to be granted when the operation ends. This creates a hard supply ceiling.
3. **Promo Type**-- Some cases were only distributed through purchase of particular "Starter Packs" or as rewards for involvement in competitions. These promotion-only cases can be more elusive than basic drop-only boxes.
4. **Skin Popularity**-- The existence of extremely desirable "Covert" or "Classified" skins inflates need. The AK-47 Fire Serpent, for example, makes the Operation Bravo Case especially valuable.
5. **Age and Nostalgia**-- Early CS: GO cases carry historic significance, appealing to veterans and collectors who missed out on the original release windows.

How Collectors Acquire Rare Cases

- **Steam Marketplace:** The primary location for acquiring cases outright. Prices are set by sellers; market fees apply.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** Platforms such as CSGOSkins.gg, Skinbay, or Buff.163 frequently list cases at a little lower commissions, but confirm seller credibility.
- **Neighborhood Giveaways & Events:** Occasionally, Valve or community influencers host free gifts where older cases are granted. Participating in main CS: GO tournaments can likewise yield legacy case drops.
- **Package Purchase:** Some collectors buy "secret boxes" that may include older cases; however, this method is risky and often not cost-effective.
